

Green camping: What NOT to do



A POORLY SET UP CAMPSITE AND BAD CAMPING PRACTICES

1. Do not cut down green trees.
2. Do not blare your radio
3. Avoid the use of batteries; replace disposable batteries with rechargeable, whenever possible.
4. Do not hang lanterns from a nail in a tree
5. Do not wash dishes, your clothes and/or your body with toxic, non-biodegradable, or phosphate-based soap.
6. Never tie your dog to a tree. This can damage the delicate bark and lead to the tree's premature death. If you bring your pooch, keep him within your site's borders with a screw-in stake.
7. Do not create piles of trash
8. Use unbreakable dishes, cups and utensils. Don't avoid washing up by using disposable paper or Styrofoam versions.
9. Don't burn plastic, metals or woods that have been treated with chemicals.
10. Do not make large campfires that are not contained to a pit.
