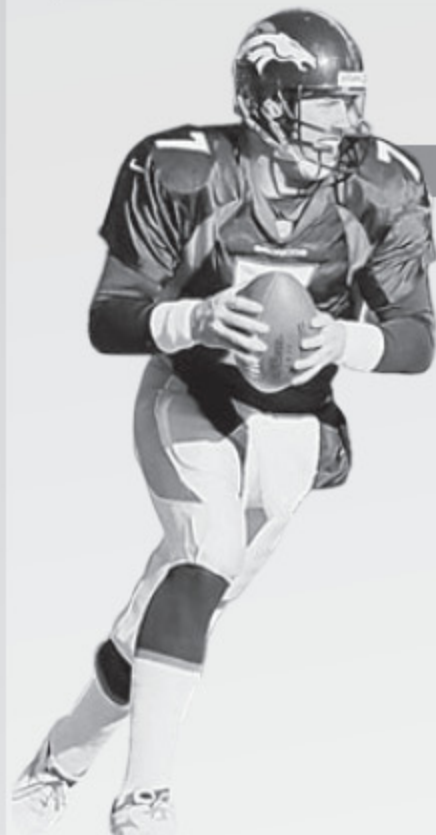


Old School vs. New School

THE CLASS OF 1983: AFTER 5 SEASONS

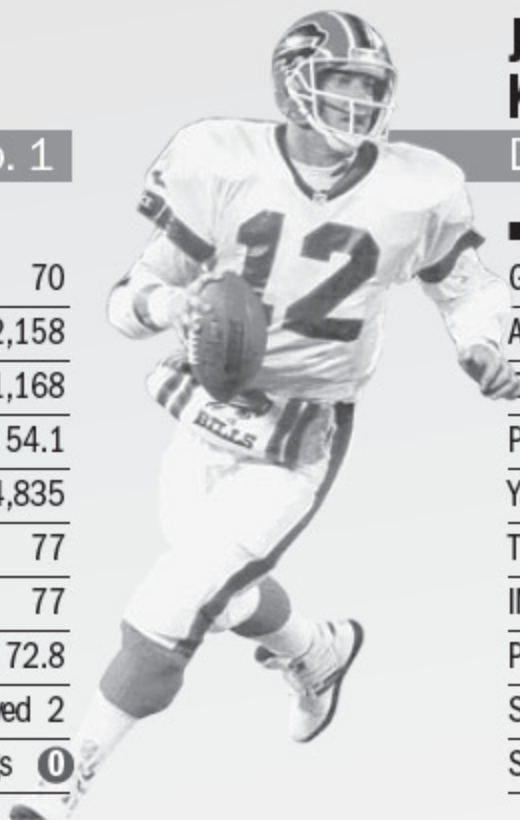
